

RUTHERFORD COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE CITIZEN COMPLAINT INFORMATION



Procedure for a citizens to follow when making complaint concerning an employee of the Rutherford County Sheriff's Office or any aspect of the Rutherford County Sheriff's Office.

How to file a complaint?

- 1. Call the Rutherford County Sheriff's Office at 615-898-7770; or
- 2. Email the Office of Professional Responsibility opr@RCSOTN.org; or
- 3. File the attached Citizen Complaint Form.

How to submit a Citizen Complaint Form?

- 1. Drop the Citizen Complaint Form off at the Rutherford County Sheriff's Office located at 940 New Salem Highway, Murfreesboro, TN 37129; or
- 2. Mail the Citizen Complaint Form to: Attention: Office of Professional Responsibility, 940 New Salem Highway, Murfreesboro, TN 37129.

Other Information

- 1. A Rutherford County Sheriff's Office Supervisor will assist you in submitting a complaint should assistance be needed. You will be asked to identify yourself and then give details about your complaint. If you choose to remain anonymous, your complaint will still be investigated to the fullest possible extent.
- 2. While your complaint is being investigated, you may be contacted and asked additional questions about your complaint. At no time during this investigation will said employee, of whom said complaint was made, be authorized to make any contact with you.
- 3. When said complaint has been investigated, the Office of Professional Responsibility or a Supervisor will respond to you explaining what has been discovered about the matter.

CITIZEN COMPLAINT INFORMATION

I,, make the following complaint with the
understanding that giving a false report by virtue of this statement as a report may
result in prosecution against me. Tennessee Code Annotated §39-16-502 prohibits the
false reporting of facts or circumstances to Police Officers in an official report.



39-16-502. False reports.

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to:
- (1) Initiate a report or statement to a law enforcement officer concerning an offense or incident within the officer's concern knowing that:
 - (A) The offense or incident reported did not occur;
 - (B) The person has no information relating to the offense or incident reported; or
 - (C) The information relating to the offense reported is false; or
- (2) Make a report or statement in response to a legitimate inquiry by a law enforcement officer concerning a material fact about an offense or incident within the officer's concern, knowing that the report or statement is false and with the intent to obstruct or hinder the officer from:
 - (A) Preventing the offense or incident from occurring or continuing to occur; or
 - (B) Apprehending or locating another person suspected of committing an offense; or
- (3) Intentionally initiate or circulate a report of a past, present, or impending bombing, fire or other emergency, knowing that the report is false or baseless and knowing:
- (A) It will cause action of any sort by an official or volunteer agency organized to deal with those emergencies;
 - (B) It will place a person in fear of imminent serious bodily injury; or
- (C) It will prevent or interrupt the occupation of any building, place of assembly, form of conveyance, or any other place to which the public has access.
- (b) (1) A violation of subdivision (a)(1) or (a)(2) is a Class D felony.
 - (2) A violation of subdivision (a)(3) is a Class C felony.
